

# Teacher Subject Specialism Training

## French/German/Spanish

This training is **FREE** of charge as it is funded by the DfE

### The purpose of TSST is to:

- improve the subject knowledge of non-specialist teachers and returning teachers
- increase the number of hours taught in these subjects

### Eligibility:

- For the purpose of TSST, non-specialists are teachers who have not undertaken initial teacher training (ITT) in the TSST subject they have applied for. Teachers without qualified teacher status (QTS) teaching in academies are also eligible. Teachers that have been awarded Qualified Teacher Learning and Skills status (QTLS) by the Society for Education are eligible if they have firm plans to teach a TSST subject in a school or sixth-form college.

### TSST is specifically for:

- non-specialist teachers who could potentially teach MFL in addition to, or as, their main subject
- non-specialist teachers who are currently teaching MFL
- specialist MFL teachers who are not currently teaching MFL who need refresher training
- specialist MFL teachers who have the capacity to teach a second language
- overseas trained teachers
- teachers who are looking to return to the profession
- non-specialist supply teachers that do not have a contract and are committed to returning to a permanent post
